

## Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

**Q. I have qualified JEE (Advanced) 2026. What is the minimum percentage required in 10+2?**

*Ans. If a candidate has qualified JEE (Advanced) 2026, the minimum requirement in 10+2 is 60% marks for General/OBC/EWS candidates and 55% marks for SC/ST/PwD candidates.*

---

**Q. I have qualified JEE (Advanced) 2026 but I do not have common rank or I have only category rank. Am I still eligible for admission at RGIPT?**

*Ans. Yes. You are eligible to apply. Seats allocation will be considered based on rank, eligibility, and seat availability.*

---

**Q. I have not qualified JEE (Advanced) 2026. Am I still eligible for admission at RGIPT?**

*Ans. No, you are not eligible for admission as per the eligibility criteria so far.*

*However, you are advised to regularly visit the RGIPT website for any updates in eligibility criteria later.*

---

**Q. I have qualified JEE (Mains) 2026. Am I still eligible for admission at RGIPT?**

*Ans. No, you are not eligible for admission as per the eligibility criteria so far.*

*However, you are advised to regularly visit the RGIPT website for any updates in eligibility criteria later.*

---

**Q. I am eligible to appear for JEE (Advanced) 2026 but not qualified. Am I still eligible for admission at RGIPT?**

*Ans. No, you are not eligible for admission as per the eligibility criteria so far.*

*However, you are advised to regularly visit the RGIPT website for any updates in eligibility criteria later.*

---

**Q. I have JEE (Advanced) 2025 rank. Am I eligible for admission at RGIPT?**

**Ans. No**, you are not eligible for admission at RGIPT based on JEE (Advanced) 2025.

---

**Q. I have qualified JEE (Advanced) 2026 but I have not completed my 12<sup>th</sup> as I failed in one of the subjects. Am I eligible for admission at RGIPT?**

**Ans. No**, you are not eligible for admission as per the eligibility criteria.

---

**Q. I did not have Mathematics/Physics/Chemistry/English as one of the subjects in 12<sup>th</sup>. Am I eligible for admission at RGIPT?**

**Ans. No**, you are not eligible for admission as per the eligibility criteria.

---

**Q. I do not have 60% in my 12<sup>th</sup> examination, and will be appearing for improvement. Am I eligible for admission at RGIPT?**

**Ans. No**, you are not eligible for admission as per the eligibility criteria.

---

**Q: I belong to the SC/ST category and have a JEE (Advanced) 2026 Preparatory Rank. Am I eligible for admission at RGIPT based on Preparatory Rank?**

**Ans. No**, RGIPT does not accept JEE (Advanced) 2026 Preparatory Ranks for admission.

However, you are advised to regularly visit the RGIPT website for any updates in eligibility criteria later.

---

**Q: I have already submitted my application. Can I change my branch preference order?**

**Ans: Yes**, you can change your branch preference order until the last date of respective round of application form submission. After the deadline, no changes to branch preference order will be considered.

If an applicant wishes to modify their branch preferences after the deadline, they must submit a fresh application using a new email ID and mobile number and pay the applicable application fee in later rounds (if conducted).

---

**Q. I wish to change my branch preference order after the branch has been allotted. Is it possible?**

**Ans.** *Sorry, no request for change in branch preference order will be considered after the branch has been allotted. Candidates are advised to carefully review and finalize their preferences before the deadline of application form submission.*

---

**Q: I received an offer letter for admission at RGIPT in Round 1, but I could not pay the fees, or I withdrew from Round 1. Can I apply for Round 2?**

**Ans:** *Yes, you can apply again in Round-2 (if conducted) by submitting a fresh application using a new mobile number for registration.*

---

**Q: I registered in Round 1, but I could not pay the application fees. Will I be eligible for Round 2?**

**Ans:** *You need to apply again in Round-2 (if conducted) by submitting a fresh application using a new mobile number for registration and paying the applicable application fees.*

---

**Q. It is difficult to make the payment online due to being in an outskirts area. Can I pay the fees through offline mode?**

**Ans.** *No, you are required to pay the fees through online mode only (after login into admission portal). For any difficulty in payment, immediately inform us for rectification.*

---

**Q. In which account do we need to pay the fees?**

**Ans.** *You are required to pay the fees in online mode (after logging into admission portal). For any difficulty in payment, immediately inform us for rectification.*

---

**Q. Are application or registration fees refundable?**

**Ans:** *No. These are non-refundable under any circumstances.*

---

**Q. How could I get admission in RGIPT?**

**Ans:** You have to apply directly in admission portal of RGIPT. Based on eligibility criteria and rank in JEE Advanced, you may be provisionally shortlisted. On submission of fee, you will be provisionally allocated a seat.

---

**Q. Who is eligible for admission to RGIPT?**

**Ans:** A candidate who satisfies the following criteria is eligible for participation in seat allocation:

1. Candidate must have **qualified in JEE (Advanced) 2026.**
2. Must have qualified and secured  **$\geq 60\%$  aggregate marks** in Class XII (relaxation to  **$\geq 55\%$**  for **SC/ST/PwD** categories).

Subjects considered for aggregate in Class XII: Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, English, and one other best subject while calculating the percentage of Marks.

---

**Q. What examinations are the basis for admission in RGIPT 2026?**

**Ans:** Admission to RGIPT is on the basis of JEE (Advanced) 2026. However, you are advised to regularly visit the RGIPT website for any updates.

---

**Q. Is registration on the RGIPT online admission portal mandatory to get a seat?**

**Ans:** Yes. It is mandatory for candidates to register through the official RGIPT online admission portal 2026 to get a seat.

---

**Q. What are supernumerary seats for female candidates?**

**Ans:** Supernumerary seats are created specifically for females in undergraduate programs to improve gender balance. These seats are in a "Female-Only" quota, separate from the "total seat" quota. Female candidates are eligible for seats from both quotas. A seat left vacant in the Female-Only quota will NOT be allocated to any non-female candidate.

---

**Q. How is a seat allocated to a candidate?**

**Ans:** A seat is allocated considering the candidate's category, position in respective rank list(s), the order of preference of selected branch and the availability of seats in eligible seat categories/quotas etc. The process follows a strict timeline and computer-operated.

---

**Q. I submitted my choices. But now I would like to make further changes to my choice list. Is it allowed? If yes, how can I exercise the option?**

**Ans:** *If a candidate wishes to edit their choices after submitting the form but before the deadline of choice/form filling, they can do so by logging in to the admission portal. After the deadline, no changes to branch preferences will be considered.*

---

**Q. The Branch choice filling deadline is already over. Am I allowed to make any changes to my choice list after the deadline?**

**Ans:** *No. You will not be allowed to edit your choice list after the deadline for form filling, i.e. you cannot change the order of your choices.*

---

**Q. I changed my last filled branch choice list, but I forgot to submit them. Now the choice filling deadline is over, and I cannot make any further changes. Will this affect the list of choices that will be considered for allocating a seat to me in RGIPT?**

**Ans:** *If you do not submit your choices, the last saved choices will be locked automatically upon reaching the deadline for choice filling. The automatically saved choice list (also visible to the candidate) will be considered for allocating a seat in RGIPT.*

---

**Q. How do I accept a seat provisionally allotted to me?**

**Ans:** A candidate who has been allocated a seat may see/download the “Initial Seat Allotment Intimation Slip”, and the steps to be followed for seat confirmation by the candidate are

- Step 1: Choose any one of the options: ‘Freeze’ or ‘Float’
- Step 2: Pay the total fee (Admission and Mess) through online portal

---

**Q. What are the options after being provisionally allocated a seat?**

**Ans:** After a seat is allocated in a round, the candidate must complete ALL steps of to accept it. These steps include accepting the seat and choosing one of the options: 'Freeze' or 'Float'. Accepting the allocated seat by choosing one of these options is mandatory to continue in the RGIPT admission process. If the allocated seat is the candidate's first choice, only the 'Freeze' option is available. If it's not the first choice and the candidate wants to be considered for higher choices, they MUST choose 'Float'.

---

**Q. What do 'Freeze', and 'Float' options mean?**

**Ans:**

- *Freeze: The candidate accepts the offered seat and is content with it, indicating she/he does not want to participate in further rounds while retaining the same seat. Such candidates are NOT considered in subsequent rounds.*
  - *Float: The candidate accepts the offered seat but indicates that if admission to a higher preference in her/his choice list is offered in subsequent rounds, she/he will accept that higher choice. The candidate will be considered for allocation in any branch higher up in their preference list.*

**Q. Can I change my chosen option (Freeze/Float)?**

**Ans:** A candidate can change from Float to Freeze in the online portal during all rounds of Seat Allocation EXCEPT the end of the admission. Once a candidate opts for 'Freeze', the option cannot be changed in subsequent rounds under any circumstances.

---

**Q. I got a seat allocated in a certain round of RGIPT counselling for the first time, but I am not interested in this seat. I would like to wait for further rounds of RGIPT to possibly get a better seat in my preference order. Do I need to do anything in the current round?**

**Ans:** If you are allocated a seat in a certain round of RGIPT counselling, you need to follow steps that include (i) acceptance of the seat, and (ii) payment of the total fee (Admission and Mess) through online portal. You need to accept the seat and choose an option of Freeze/Float if you wish to be considered for a seat of a higher preference in the subsequent rounds (other than the end of admission). If you fail to complete any of the steps for seat acceptance, your allocated seat will be CANCELLED, and you will no longer be able to participate in the seat allocation process. ---

**Q. I was allocated a seat in one of the previous rounds and now I have been allocated another seat of a higher preference in my choice list. Can I go back to the seat allotted to me in the previous round?**

**Ans: NO.** *Once you are allocated a seat of a higher preference based on your float option, your accepted seat from the earlier round will be automatically cancelled, and you cannot get the previously allotted seat.*

---

**Q. I got allocated a seat of my preference in my choice list in a certain round, and I am satisfied with the allotted program. I do not want to participate in further rounds of seat allocation. What should I do to keep the allocated seat?**

**Ans:** *If you are satisfied with the allotted seat and do not wish to participate in further rounds of seat allocation, you need to choose the option “Freeze” while accepting the seat and complete all the steps of the online acceptance process. Not choosing any option in this case will be considered as a rejection of the offered seat, and the candidate will not be considered for seat allocation in the further rounds (if any).*

---

**Q. I got allocated and accepted a seat in a certain round. I would like to wait for further rounds of RGIPT counselling to possibly get a seat of a higher preference. Which option should I choose to be considered for further rounds of RGIPT counselling?**

**Ans:** *If you have accepted a seat in a certain round and would like to be considered for a seat of a higher preference, you need to choose the option of ‘Float’. Further, if you are allocated a seat of a higher preference in a subsequent round of seat allocation, your earlier accepted seat will be automatically cancelled and you will have to accept the newly allocated seat. If you are not allocated a seat of a higher preference in a subsequent round, you will continue in the already accepted seat, and you will also be considered for seat allocation (based on your preference in the choice list) in the subsequent rounds (if any) if you continue with the ‘Float’ option.*

---

**Q. I was allocated a seat in one of the previous rounds, and I had chosen the option of Float for the subsequent rounds. I do not wish to participate in further rounds of seat allocation. Can I change my option from Float to Freeze?**

**Ans:** *Except at the end of the admission process, you can change your option from float to freeze in the online admission portal.*

---

**Q. I was allocated a seat in one of the previous rounds, and I had chosen the option of Freeze for the subsequent rounds. Can I change my option to Float in a subsequent round?**

**Ans:** *NO. You cannot change the option to Float if you choose the option 'Freeze' while accepting the allocated seat. Further, you will not be considered for seat allocation in subsequent rounds (if any) of RGIPT counselling while your accepted seat remains allocated to you.*

---

**Q. I have been allocated a seat in RGIPT counselling for the first time. I have accepted the seat, chosen my willingness, but I have not yet paid my fees. Will the allocated seat be confirmed to me by the reporting officials?**

**Ans:** *You MUST pay the fees and complete all the steps in the same round of seat allocation for continuing with the counselling process to avail the seat in RGIPT. Your allocated seat will be CANCELLED, and you will no longer be able to participate in the subsequent rounds of the seat allocation process (if any) if you do not complete all the steps of the online process, including the payment of the fees.*

---

**Q. I was allocated and confirmed a seat in a certain round. I have now been allocated another seat of a higher preference in my choice list in subsequent round. Do I need to report again online?**

**Ans: NO,** *if you have already completed all the steps in a certain round and you have been allocated another seat of a higher preference in your choice list, you don't have to repeat the online process. If you are satisfied with the allotted seat in subsequent sub-round and do not wish to participate in further rounds of seat allocation, you need to choose the option "Freeze". You will be considered for seat allocation (based on your preference in the choice list) in the subsequent rounds (if any) if you continue with the 'Float' option.*

---

**Q. I am a PwD candidate. Do I need to physically visit the verification centre for PwD status verification?**

**Ans:** Candidates are not required to visit the institute physically during counselling process. Documents will be verified in physical registration. If her/his PwD status is found to be invalid, then her/his candidature will be cancelled.

---

**Q. Can I withdraw from the seat allocation process after accepting a seat?**

**Ans:** Yes, a candidate who has accepted/allotted a seat can withdraw from the process. The withdrawal process involves logging into the online portal, submitting a request through withdrawal option (may be confirming with OTP). In case of withdrawal, the allocated seat is cancelled, and the candidate will not be considered for subsequent rounds.

**Q. I was allocated and confirmed a seat in a certain sub-round (1.1 or 1.2 etc.) and deposited the total fees but requesting the withdrawal till the last date of respective sub-round in which seat is offered. How much amount to be refunded.**

**Ans:** If you have deposited the total amount of fees and seeking withdrawal of program for whatsoever reason till the last date of respective sub-round. The remaining amount will be refundable after a deduction of Rs. 1,500/- processing fee from the total fee deposited.

**Q. I was allocated and confirmed a seat in a certain sub-round (1.1 or 1.2 etc.) and deposited the total fees but requesting the withdrawal after the last date of respective sub-round in which seat is offered. How much amount to be refunded.**

**Ans:** If you have deposited the total amount of fees and seeking withdrawal of program for whatsoever reason after the last date of respective sub-round. Only caution money (Rs. 9000/-) and Mess fee will be refunded.

**Q. I have withdrawn my seat. When will my admission fee be refunded.**

**Ans:** *The amount will be refunded to your account within 2–3 weeks after the completion of the respective round. In some cases, the refund process may take longer than 3 weeks due to technical issues or processing delays.*
